My name is Ian and this is my story

As a child, my family attended church almost every week. I learned about Jesus and I believed that he came to Earth to die for my sins. As a teenager, I was trying desperately to be popular, however, and I saw Christianity as a bunch of rules that hindered me from making friends. So, I would attend church on Sunday with my family, and spend the rest of my week doing things I knew were wrong, desperately trying to fit in.

This led to numerous poor decisions, including lots of drinking in high school. In college, when I was completely free to make my own decisions, I went to church less and drank more. Before I knew what had happened, by my senior year I was drunk almost all the time. It was clearly hurting my health and relationships, but I didn't want to stop.

Fast forward 3 years after graduation, and I was still drinking heavily and ended up getting me into some trouble with the law. This was a huge wake-up call and happened around the same time I had started attending a Bible study my manager had invited me to. We were studying Romans chapter 6 which teaches that we are either a slave to sin which leads to death, or slaves to obedience which leads to righteousness.

I was feeling pretty close to rock bottom and this passage showed me that I was trying to live in a middle ground that doesn't exist. Sin is powerful, and I wasn't just dabbling in it, I was a slave to it. Not only was sin destroying my life, but it was separating me from God both in this life and eternally. I remember praying to Jesus and telling him that I wanted him to be my Lord and Savior. I was always cool with the Savior part, but I was ready for him to be my Lord!

When I finally let go and gave Jesus control of my life, my life dramatically improved. It didn't magically make things better, but as I pursued Jesus and his teachings He taught me how to rely on him for the strength to make better decisions. I was "set free from sin" (from Romans 6), and have been free from alcohol for over 5 years.

What's more, he replaced all that junk I gave up with good things: Instead of trying to please others, my security is in my God who loves me unconditionally. My fears are gone and I sleep easy, knowing that I will spend an eternity in heaven with Jesus. My life of doubt is now a life of purpose as God uses me as a part of his plan, including sharing my story with you! I pray that you trust Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior too.
